To you be highest glory and praise for ever

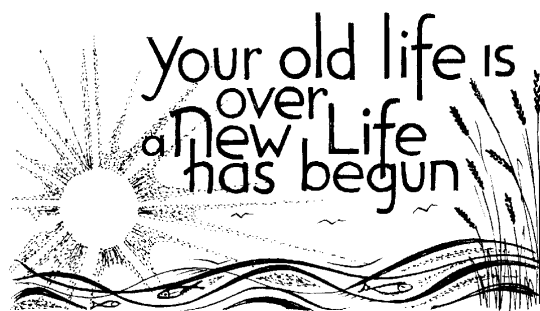

SECOND READING FOR THE DAY – CORINTHIANS 5:6-8

You must know how even a small amount of yeast is enough to leaven all the dough, so get rid of all the old yeast, and make yourselves into a completely new batch of bread, unleavened as you are meant to be. Christ, our passover, has been sacrificed; let us celebrate the feast, by getting rid of all the old yeast of evil and wickedness, having only the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.



Easter is a day of new beginnings. Sadly, those who had hoped to be baptised at the Easter Vigil will have had their hopes put on hold. It highlights the reality of Easter 2020. But, as many of us have found – Lent has been more profoundly Lent than anything we have experienced before. Giving up chocolate pales into insignificance in comparison with fasting from our shared celebrations of Mass – from hugs with our family – and the popping out for a coffee with friends. But at the same time as experiencing the losses, we may well have discovered some of that “old yeast” – the things that have, now we look at them, have grown stale and no longer give us the life they once did.

- Read the passage slowly – and notice which words or images speak to you...
- What hope do you find in this Reading?
- What are the things that you are now seeing as “old yeast”? How can you get rid of them – not just for today but when the crisis is over?
- How can you share hope and joy with others this Easter?

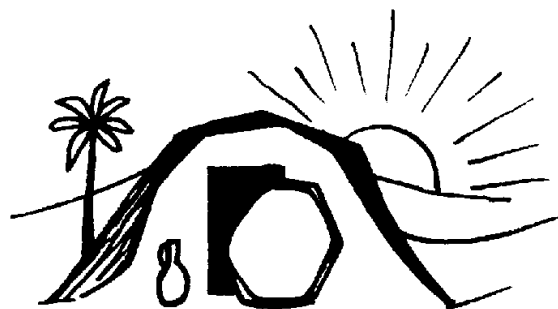
Through the same Christ our Lord, Amen

GOSPEL OF THE DAY – JOHN 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'



So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

- Spend a few minutes playing this Gospel account in your mind and heart. Try to imagine what it was like for Mary, Simon Peter and John to see an empty tomb and the body of their Lord, apparently, removed from it.
- Around the world today, people are facing death – their own or their loved ones. Many others will be bereaved and desolate that they could not be with their beloved as they died. Their funeral rites – which offer such comfort and hope – will have been curtailed. They will know that moment that Mary experienced – “they have taken away my... - and I don't know where he/she is...Which ward – which bed – which funeral directors... Pray for them and invite these three great saints to pray for them with you – asking them to enter into the desolation of the losses and say “we felt that too – but the Lord is risen – and there is hope”.
- How might you spread Easter hope and joy today? Phone calls? Skype? Planting up something that will bring colour to your neighbourhood? How can you share our faith that life is stronger than death – that Jesus is risen?

Where has God spoken to you today?

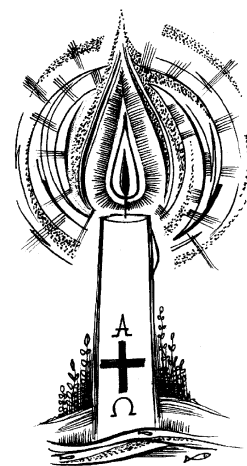
Where have you found joy and hope?
