JOB DESCRIPTION - HEAD OF PARISH CATECHETICS

This is a full-time post based at the Maryvale Institute, which is the department of the Archdiocese of Birmingham responsible for the oversight of catechesis and adult Christian formation within the diocesan mission. The Institute is also an international college of further and higher education providing adult formation in the service of the Church, both national and universal.

Reporting to the Director of the Institute, and guided by the Archbishop's pastoral vision for the diocese, the Head of Parish Catechetics will take a lead in promoting and supporting faith formation at all levels in the context of the New Evangelisation. The position is open to a suitably qualified and experienced layperson or a professed religious or permanent deacon (subject to the approval of their ecclesiastical superior).

The principal duties include the following:

Developing and updating diocesan policies in order to promote and facilitate consistency of practice across the diocese in all areas of catechetical ministry, including the selection and formation of catechists, and the content and delivery of adult catechetical programmes, including RCIA;

Promoting a catechesis which has the General Directory of Catechesis and the Catechism of the Catholic Church as the key reference points, and with particular emphasis on implementing the new General Directory for Catechesis throughout the diocese:

Collaborating with diocesan evangelisation staff to promote the vision of missionary parishes as communities of missionary disciples called to grow into maturity in Christ and become key agents of the New Evangelisation;

Working alongside parish clergy to enable and support effective catechesis in parishes;

Providing continuing formation to parish catechists; including through the establishment and support of local catechists' networks or associations;

Providing training and catechetical formation, in conjunction with diocesan staff and other agencies as appropriate, for those in parishes involved in:

- RCIA and adult catechesis
- Scripture courses

- Children's Liturgy of the Word
- Baptism Preparation for parents
- Children's sacramental preparation (including sessions for parents)
- Marriage preparation
- Reading in the Liturgy of the Word
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion
- Presiding at Eucharistic services
- Catechesis of children and adults with special needs

Implementing, evaluating and adapting existing resources, and developing new resources in response to new and evolving demands;

Contributing catechetical input to various Diocesan and National initiatives;

Advising the Archbishop, diocesan clergy and others in all matters related to catechesis;

Promoting Maryvale courses in the parishes of the Archdiocese.

This is a full-time post. The hours of work are variable but include considerable evening and weekend working, and will involve extensive travel within, and occasionally beyond, the diocese.
