THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000

I am writing to make a request under the Freedom of Information Act and would request that your Trust answer a few questions about issues of religious belief.

The purpose of this request is to enable the Church, and other agencies, to identify how they can work with the NHS to support it in addressing issues of religion and faith within its Equality Framework.

The results of this request, along with personal interviews with healthcare workers, will form the basis of a report which we will share with NHS agencies and other interested parties. No NHS Trust or organisation will be identified or "singled out" for any reason. We will want to identify and share particularly good practice anonymously without identifying your Trust, though if we identify particularly good practice, we may want to contact your Trust for permission to identify your Trust and the good work your Trust has done. This will not happen without your permission.
