Reach Out To Welcome Home

Most Catholic families have members who, for different reasons, no longer go to Mass: some lost contact during their teenage years, others drifted away after a broken marriage, whilst some have had painful experiences with the Catholic community. Our initiative aims to encourage Catholics to listen respectfully and lovingly to people's stories and invite them back. A simple invitation could make all the difference in the world.

A recent report highlighted that three million people in England and Wales would come to Church if invited. It is estimated that at least two-thirds of the Catholic community are non churchgoing (lapsed). You and other members of your parish are therefore invited to go out in search of the lost sheep like Jesus himself. Advent, Christmas and the New Year are good times to invite people back.

How To Get Involved?



A variety of posters have been designed to support your outreach in recognition of the fact that 'no one size fits all'. All the posters are available online. Please do consider putting one on display on an exterior notice board, visible to those outside the church building. Perhaps also, with permission, display another in a non church venue such as a local shop, library, pub, community centre or school.



Research suggests that if you **invite** seven people to a parish event, it is probable that one person will attend. Ask everyone who comes to Sunday Mass to issue an invitation to a non churchgoing Catholic during Advent, Christmas and the New Year, to attend a service. Ready-made invitation cards are available online.

consider organising a 'Come and See' or appropriately named **welcome evening** for people who want to explore returning to the practice of their faith. A format for such an evening can be downloaded from www.catholicchurch.org.uk/homemission
