Our regular ecumenical feature takes as its focus the International Alpha Conference held in London in June 2009.

This year's Alpha International Conference was attended by over 1,500 delegates from 100 countries; amongst these were over twenty Catholic Bishops. For the first time in the history of the event, such was the size of the Episcopal presence that a special Bishops' Stream was hosted by the Anglican Bishop of London.

Alpha is one of the most well-known evangelisation programmes in England and Wales. The course aims to provide an introduction to the Christian faith and, so far 13 million people have attended the course in over 160 countries.

The English and Welsh Catholic delegation was led by Rt Rev Thomas McMahon, Bishop of Brentwood, who said: 'Alpha is the most marvellous tool for evangelisation. Alpha serves to bring faith alive, and to me, that is the most important thing in the world, because if a person's faith and belief in Jesus becomes "real" as opposed to "notional" then you see the whole of life differently.'

CASE works closely with the Alpha for Catholics (AfC) team and supported a reception for the attending Bishops at Archbishop's House, Westminster. 'Flame-Filled' **Training**

More than 700 people from all parts of England and Wales have taken part in the first ever national evangelisation training tour. So far, 10 'Fanning the Flames' events have taken place, jointly led by members of the CASE team and a representative of the Catholic Evangelisation Services (the producers of the CaFE DVD resources).

Each day has been designed to help people unpack a Catholic understanding of evangelisation, and to ensure that they are equipped and resourced to do it, specifically by setting up parish evangelisation teams. People from local evangelisation initiatives have provided snapshots of how they reach out to people. A resources table was set up so that individuals and teams had easy access to the support outreach materials.

One participant enthused: 'It was brilliant to hear the ideas that other people have already found successful; we're definitely going to set up an evangelisation team in our parish and try the same!' Another spoke of how: 'It was reassuring to find that we had similar concerns, most of which lessened over the day.'

Upcoming dates include Newmarket on 17 October, Birkenhead on 24 October and additional events have been requested for 2010 in the Archdiocese of Liverpool and in the Diocese of Northampton. Meanwhile Matthew* emailed: 'I am at the enquiry stage about the Catholic Church... and don't know where to start... Your thoughts and advice would be so welcome.

Each year, the Office is contacted by thousands 'Frequently Asked Questions' online area. of individuals who are looking for advice, information and guidance. This is a strong indication that there is no shortage of spiritual seekers and of resting (lapsed) Catholics wanting to be reconciled.

Most recently, we have tried to respond to the spiritual needs of those affected by the recession by launching a dedicated web page: www.life4seekers.co.uk/uncertainty Some of the other projects being developed include: an in-depth Catechism layer to the website called the 'Wisdom Well': a PowerPoint entitled 'What is a Catholic?'; and an expanded



Faith and Culture: Sacramental Church

It's good to remind ourselves that reflection is absolutely essential: on a human level, we have a need to take stock of where we've been and what we've done in life in order to effectively move forward.

On a spiritual level, 'taking stock' is also about discerning the voice of God, and, as St John reminds us in the Book of Revelation, it is also about lending an ear to what the Spirit is saying to the Churches.

As a means of facilitating the reflective and listening processes, CASE has co-ordinated a Symposium – a dialogue between representatives of the New Expressions of Mission in the Church, including the New Movements, and those engaged in academic reflection on faith and culture.

The dialogue is beginning with a reflection on the implications for culturally relevant mission, of being a sacramental Church. How does a culture steeped in relativism, for example, respond to the Sacraments? What does it mean to be a sacramental presence in a world in which many people would never have cause to enter our church buildings? How and when do we help people who are alienated from organised religion to move from hearing an initial proclamation of the Gospel to the Lord's table at the Eucharist?

We hope that by offering space for these questions to be aired and examined, CASE will support the Church in England and Wales to



more effectively engage with Home Mission. The fruits of the dialogues on these themes will be widely available from mid October 2009 at: www.caseresources.org.uk/culturetalk.



CASE has launched an initiative called 'Little Way Week' which coincides with the end of the tour of the Relics of St Thérèse of Lisieux in England and Wales (18 - 24 October 2009). As a follow up to Home Mission Sunday and, as a way of reaching out to others with the love of Jesus Christ, every baptised person is invited to get involved for a week by doing at least one 'little' daily service activity.

St Thérèse is the universal Patroness of the Missions and received a teaching which has been called the 'Little Way' the saint lived by this pathway which is a commitment to do small tasks everyday with love. It is not about seeking greatness or gratitude; it is about selflessness and service and is a way of witnessing to the love of God and neighbour.
