Antiphons

The following antiphons will be especially suitable as the Opening Song (62), or as the Acclamation (71).

- 1. How holy this feast in which Christ is our food: his passion is recalled, grace fills our hearts, and we receive a pledge of the glory to come.
- 2. How gracious you are, Lord:
 your gift of bread from heaven
 reveals a Father's love and brings us perfect joy.
 You fill the hungry with good things
 and send away empty the rich in their pride.
- 3. Body of Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary, body bowed in agony, raised upon the cross and offered for us in sacrifice, body pierced and flowing with blood and water, come at the hour of our death as our living bread, the foretaste of eternal glory: come, Lord Jesus, loving and gracious Son of Mary.
- 4. I am the living bread come down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread he shall live forever. The bread I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.

The following Responsories will be especially suitable after the readings during the period of Adoration (65).
