AN INVITATION

You will be aware that Pope Francis has written recently: "May the balm of mercy reach everyone, both believers and those far away, as a sign that the Kingdom of God is already present in our midst! ... The Church is commissioned to announce the mercy of God, the beating heart of the Gospel, which in its own way must penetrate the heart and mind of every person." (Misericordiae Vultus 5, 12)

PROCLAIM God's Mercy

On 20 September the bishops in England and Wales invite every parish and religious house to celebrate Home Mission Sunday. In choosing this year's theme two priorities are particularly proposed for prayer and reflection:

PROCLAIM: That as a fruit of prayer every Catholic, parish and religious house will take a new step to share their faith more joyfully and confidently, and so build missionary parishes and communities.

God's Mercy: That Catholic individuals, parishes and religious houses will consider afresh how they will present the 'balm of God's mercy' to others, in response to Pope Francis' announcement that there be a Jubilee Year of Mercy, starting in December.
