CAFOD "The World Can't Wait" London Rally: Saturday 2nd June

Bishops from Africa, Asia and Europe met Prime Minister Tony Blair in London at the end of April to remind him of Britain's commitment to the pledges made at the Gleneagles G8 summit in 2005. Then world leaders pledged to make poverty history by doubling aid and cancelling poor countries debts. But the G8 countries are not on target to keep their promises.

This June, the British PM will go to summits of European and G8 governments. CAFOD wants to ensure he sets off with the message of *"the world can't wait*" ringing in his ears.
