

### **First Reading**

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 22:3-16

Paul said to the people, 'I am a Jew and was born at Tarsus in Cilicia. I was brought up here in this city. I studied under Gamaliel and was taught the exact observance of the Law of our ancestors. In fact, I was as full of duty towards God as you are today. I even persecuted this Way to the death, and sent women as well as men to prison in chains as the high priest and the whole council of elders can testify, since they even sent me with letters to their brothers in Damascus. When I set off it was with the intention of bringing prisoners back from there to Jerusalem for punishment.

'I was on that journey and nearly at Damascus when about midday a bright light from heaven suddenly shone round me. I fell to the ground and heard a voice saying, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" I answered: Who are you, Lord? and he said to me, "I am Jesus the Nazarene, and you are persecuting me." The people with me saw the light but did not hear his voice as he spoke to me. I said: What am I to do Lord? The Lord answered, "Stand up and go into Damascus, and there you will be told what you have been appointed to do." The light had been so dazzling that I was blind and my companions had to take me by the hand; and so I came to Damascus.

'Someone called Ananias, a devout follower of the Law and highly thought of by all the Jews living there, came to see me; he stood beside me and said, "Brother Saul, receive your sight." Instantly my sight came back and I was able to see him. Then he said, "The God of our ancestors has chosen you to know his will, to see the Just One and hear his own voice speaking, because you are to be his witness before all mankind, testifying to what you have seen and heard. And now why delay? It is time you were baptised and had your sins washed away while invoking his name." 'This is the word of the Lord.







### Investiture with Ring, Mitre and Pastoral Staff

The Ring, carried by Sister Mary of Carmel, the Mitre, carried by Sister Moira Cashmore FCJ, and the Pastoral Staff, carried by Bishop John Crowley, are brought forward in procession.

*The Archbishop places the ring on the finger of Bishop Drainey saying:* 

Archbishop:	Take this ring, the seal of your fidelity.
	With faith and love
	protect the bride of God, his holy Church.

In silence, he places the mitre upon Bishop Drainey's head.

Lastly, he places in his hands the pastoral staff (the Braganza Crozier).

In 1688 at the request of King James II the Holy See divided the country from one into four Vicariates Apostolic, or Districts (a form of Church government used when Diocesan structures are not possible). This was a major step forward towards the restoration of the ancient Catholic Hierarchy, which ultimately was achieved in 1850. However, the first Vicar apostolic of the newly established Northern District, Bishop James Smith, who had moved to York, had almost immediately to flee for his safety to the obscurity of Wycliffe Hall, the home of the Tunstall family, after James II was deposed. The Bishop's crozier had been a personal gift to him from Queen Catherine of Braganza, the widow of King Charles II. In the turmoil of the time, the crozier passed from the ownership of Bishop Smith and eventually found a safe home in York Minster. The Diocese of Middlesbrough is deeply grateful to the Minster authorities for the loan of this crozier today, on the occasion of the Episcopal Ordination of Bishop Drainey.

Bishop Drainey sets aside his staff and receives the Kiss of Peace from the Archbishop and then from all the other bishops as they welcome him into the Episcopal Ministry and pray that the peace of Christ may be with him. During this the following is sung.
