CONVERSATION STARTERS

Warm up

What would you normally do this evening? What do you do in your spare time? Have you got any plans for Christmas?

Questions about their lives

What are the demands on your life? What do you enjoy about life? What do you struggle with? How do you feel about making important life choices? Who do you trust/listen to?

Questions of faith

(Please reassure them that you are not looking for 'correct' answers but what they really think)

What do you understand by the word 'faith'? What role if any does your faith play in your life? Have you ever had a spiritual experience? What do you think of God? Jesus? The Church? How can the Church get better at journeying with young people through life? How can we help you to involve God in your important life choices? Is there something you have always wanted to ask a priest but never had the opportunity?
