HOMILY HINTS ON THE SYNOD ON YOUTH, FAITH AND VOCATIONAL DISCERNMENT

Link with the readings: 'I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view.'

Last year Pope Francis asked that we, the whole body of Christ, take the time to look after young people, particularly in relation to their faith and vocational discernment. As we hear in the first reading, to look after refers to meeting their needs, but how can we do this without finding out what their needs are?

Potential Story: It is much easier to see a broken leg than a broken heart and applying the remedy for a broken leg to a broken heart is not of much use, so we need to listen to young people. Listen to what life is like for them, listen to their questions, cares, concerns, hopes and fears. Then, by trusting that the Holy Spirit is at work in the conversation, we can begin to look for a solution with them, a solution that provides them with the opportunity to encounter Christ and find out who God has created them to be.
