Evening Prayer of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Eve of the Installation of the Archbishop of Westminster

Wednesday 20 May 2009 7:00 p.m.

The Installation of an Archbishop is a joyful occasion of great significance in the life of a diocese. The rites are rich in symbolism, incorporating detailed ceremonial.

Before such an event it is good to make time for prayer; as individuals, as communities, as a diocese and to pray for ourselves, our Church and our world.

The public prayer of God's people has always been considered among the first duties of the Church. Over the centuries, the traditional elements of Christian prayer were carefully arranged, to sanctify the whole day in prayer in the Divine Office.

The Office of Vespers, the traditional Evening Prayer of the Church, offers to God our praise for the day that is ending, and in the words of the Canticle of Mary, 'glorifies the Lord' for his goodness to us.

This evening's Vesper psalms and antiphons are taken from the Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary, invoking her prayers as Patron of our Diocese under the title Our Blessed Lady, the Immaculate.

THE SCRIPTURE READING

Philippians 3:8-14

I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want to know is Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.



May your Church be united heart and soul, held fast by love, and may your faithful be joined in continuous prayer, with Mary the mother of Jesus. R.


