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# **Christian Unity**

#### Background

The Week of was originally begun in 1908 by the American Episcopalian clergyman Paul Wattson who later became a Catholic. The Week begins on 18 January and ends on 25 January—the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul. Material for the Week of Prayer is prepared in collaboration by Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and The Commission on Faith and Order of the World Council of Churches. Each year this material is produced by Christians in a different country.

### Prayer of the Faithful

- For unity among the churches, a unity founded on truth and compassion.
- For the churches to find a common voice, to speak on matters that affect the whole of society.

All-powerful and ever-living God, the lasting health of all who believe in you, hear us as we ask your loving help for the sick; restore their health, that they may again offer joyful thanks in your Church.

#### Opportunities and Challenges


- Take copies of the parish bulletin to those who are sick and housebound.

- For teachers, catechists and all who share what God has done; may they always be open to deepening their knowledge.

#### Prayer

God is the source of all wisdom and knowledge. Let us ask him to bless those who

seek to learn and their teachers.

For students, that the Spirit of God may grant them the gifts of wisdom of understanding.

For teachers, that they may share their knowledge with gentleness, patience, and concern for their students.
