The Bishops' Conference Department for Evangelisation and Catechesis has initiated, thanks to your generous support and that of a breadth of partners, the following projects in support of reaching out to those baptised who never or rarely attend Mass:

National Core Group - set up and sponsored gatherings of a national team to further this area of mission

National Tour - funded a national tour comprising of six free regional resource days across England and Wales. For an overview please see the Home Mission Sunday web page (address above).

New Resources - materials generated from the national tour are gradually being published online for free download.

Research - a year-long project has begun to explore how the Church can connect with and serve non-churchgoing Catholics who send their children to Catholic schools.

Pilot Project - based in the Nottingham Diocese to train and support parish evangelisation teams for this area of ministry.
