AN OVERVIEW FOR PARISHES

Introduction

In 2015 the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales launched a significant evangelisation initiative called Proclaim '15 to support, inspire and encourage new expressions of parish evangelisation. The project was designed to affirm the good work already being done by the Catholic community, and to provide resources and events to profile and develop new expressions of Catholic joy and missionary outreach. The legacy of this initiative extends beyond its launch year and this booklet aims to provide a snapshot of the materials now available.



Proclaim has five parts:

I. PRAYER

Network of prayer parishes are invited to prioritise praying for evangelisation in their local area.

2. SMALL GROUPS

Materials are provided to encourage Catholics to meet in small parish groups to explore their response to the call to evangelise.

3. EVENT

A National Catholic Evangelisation Conference took place on 11 July 2015 in Birmingham for 850 evangelisation representatives from across England and Wales. As a fruit of this event, new Proclaim groups were formed in every diocese to take forward the work of local outreach.

4. LEGACY

Local events - templates have been provided to enable dioceses, deaneries and parishes to have their own Proclaim gatherings.

5. RESOURCES

New Evangelisation resources have been made available as a fruit of the National Conference to equip parish evangelisation.

Practical and Enabling

Proclaim has a practical and 'how to' focus because while there is enthusiasm within the Catholic community to share confidently and joyfully our Faith, it can at times be hard to discern

where to begin. This initiative aims to address that difficulty and is inspired by Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium, in which he writes: 'I wish to encourage the

Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelisation marked by this joy, while pointing out new paths for the Church's journey in years to come.'

Prioritising Prayer

Cardinal Nichols said at the Proclaim
Conference in July 2015: 'To understand our mission then we have to go to the heart of God, the very mystery of the Holy Trinity, the inner life of God... Only from within that inner heart of God does our mission arise. Only from that inner heart of God does our mission find its

shape, its purpose, its energy.'

Prayer is the foundation of all missionary endeavour and you will find on our website a Proclaim prayer that can be reproduced. Some parishes have already used it to create parish prayer cards for distribution. Also available is a template

for a parish evening of prayer. You might also choose to offer an annual Novena at Pentecost in support of your parish mission.

Small Group Materials

Three evangelisationthemed sessions for use in small groups in our parishes are available for download and reproduction.

The sessions are timeless so can be used any time during the year to initiate prayer and reflection about the foundation stones of Catholic evangelisation.

Each session includes a story, questions to ponder, a Scripture reading, prayer and extract from Evangelii Gaudium.

They are themed:

- I) Meeting Jesus
- 2) A Missionary Disciple
- 3) Jesus is Alive

The materials aim to inspire a practical and local response to the call to share our faith.





An ideas and resource booklet is available to support the organisation of local Proclaim events and gatherings in your area.

These events can be of any duration, but should aim to bring people

together to share ideas and receive inspiration in support of local evangelisation. The resource booklet provides:

- Guidance about what a Proclaim event should include
- Prayer suggestions
- Draft outline for a day programme
- Possible workshop themes

The Proclaim initiative offers practical insights through the provision of workshop materials and 'top tips' sheets, covering eleven themes. Among the topics covered are:

1) Prayer as the foundation of a missionary parish

- 2) Vision and Strategy for parish evangelisation
- 3) Ministry and outreach to non churchgoing (lapsed) Catholics
- 4) Creating a parish evangelisation team
- 5) Building welcoming and family-friendly parishes

- 6) Offering prayer experiences as effective outreach
- 7) Sharing your faith testimony
- 8) Reaching out to the unchurched
- 9) Being a poor Church for the poor

Also covered: Youth Ministry and the basic Gospel message.
