Role Purpose:

The Policy and Research Analyst will undertake research across a diverse range of national and international policy areas with which the Church engages. The role will draw upon the knowledge of experts from a range of fields to develop policy and position statements rooted in Church teaching and the lives of the people of God.

The role will contribute towards the proclamation of the love of Jesus Christ being the golden thread which motivates all the work of the Secretariat and permeates every aspect of the work of supporting the Bishops' mission.

Key Responsibilities:

- To undertake research and develop position statements on a wide range of projects.
- To provide information and analysis on domestic and international issues in the form of written and oral briefings to colleagues, bishops, and others, based on research evidence.
- To maintain awareness of political and social changes to ensure that the policy voice of the Church remains relevant.
- To make presentations and representations on behalf of and alongside Bishops.
- To work in close collaboration with Partnership and Public Affairs team colleagues to ensure that the Bishops are heard as a consistent and collegiate voice externally.
- To contribute towards the Church's role in public life supporting the Partnership and Public Affairs team work with Whitehall and Cardiff departments, Ministers, MPs and MSs, special advisers and other relevant people.
- To support the Parliamentary and Policy Internship programme and the Faith in Politics Network.
- To work in partnership with the agencies and aligned organisations of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, drawing upon their knowledge and insight.
- To draw upon the different perspectives of Catholic and other organisations in order to formulate effective policy with Bishops.
- To work closely with the Communications team to maximise the impact of our messages and progress our objectives.
- To develop an understanding of the contribution the Catholic Church in England and Wales makes as part of the Universal Church both to other Bishops' Conferences and the Holy See.
- To work with colleagues across CaTEW to provide professional excellence across all disciplines in support of the Bishops and their defined mission;
