These figures represent us, pilgrims of hope, on a journey to bring the good news to the poor, and to follow evermore closely Jesus Christ, in whom we find our salvation.

This is an opportunity for us all to journey together as Pilgrims of Hope.

CATHEDRAL CHURCH OF ST MARY & ST BONIFACE, PLYMOUTH

CHURCH OF ST BONIFACE CREDITON

A PILGRIMAGE CENTRE FOR THE HOLY YEAR

It is an honour for us to be a place of pilgrimage during this Jubilee Year.

Regular Catholic worship was only restored to Crediton in the 1920s, but the parish has grown steadily. Today, we have a significant and stable presence greatly enriched by Polish and Indian parishioners.

We have a beautiful modern church dating from the 1960s, which contains two relics of Saint Boniface: one set within the altar and one within the adjoining shrine (part of a vertebra). These relics were given to us by the Bishop of Fulda, which is one of the many dioceses and abbeys founded by Saint Boniface, and where his body now reposes.

We welcome parties of pilgrims, including many large groups who travel overland from Central and Southern Germany who often express their joy to be at the birthplace of this great missionary bishop, who is highly regarded in Germany and did so much in organising what would later become the Frankish Empire. One pilgrim, a salaried member of the diocesan curia at Fulda, once memorably expressed her joy at being here by gazing around with a wide-eyed expression, quietly saying to herself, "Wow, so this is where it all began."

Today, Saint Boniface is one of the most prominent saints in Germany and Holland and is the patron of the Diocese of Plymouth. We welcome all those who will be making a pilgrimage to us during the Year of the Jubilee. Saint Boniface, pray for us.
