## Why pray to St Ephrem?

For the needs of Syria, we pray to St Ephrem because he was a great theological doctor of the fourth century who understood the tradition of the Church in his native land and the needs of its people, having suffered social injustice himself. Then, when Syria was faced with famine and conflict, he volunteered to distribute food in an equitable way to those who needed it most and to encourage people to share what they had in the interests of the common good. St Ephrem died serving others; in 373AD, he caught the plague while ministering to the sick. His 'Hymns to Light' show a deep awareness through their expressions of their love of God for the support our brothers and sisters in Syria need in our own time:

*His glory shines upon the world  
and enlightens the very depths of the abyss.  
Death is annihilated, night has vanished,  
and the gates of Sheol are broken.  
Creatures lying in darkness from ancient times  
are clothed in light.  
he brings salvation and grants us life.  
When he manifests himself,  
the saints awaiting him in weariness and sorrow,  
will go forth to meet him with lighted lamps."*
